Fire Safety Training

Clearly it makes sound business sense to ensure your employees know what to do in the event of fire, but more importantly how to prevent fires occurring in the first place. Current legislation requires employers to provide adequate training in fire awareness/safety for all members of their staff.

- Human behaviour in a fire situation.

- Basic principles of risk assessment.
- Routine fire prevention measures.
- Modes of evacuation.
- Fire drills and pre-planning.
- Fire safety features and facilities.
- Firefighting equipment.

On completion delegates will receive a certificate valid for two years.
