Request:

I am writing to formally request information under the Freedom of Information Act 2000 concerning a fire incident that occurred at the property located at 15 Northumberland Avenue, Enfield EN1 4HF.

I am particularly interested in obtaining any and all records related to the fire, including, but not limited to:

- 1. The date and time of the incident.
- 2. The cause of the fire, if determined.
- 3. Any reports or assessments made by the fire brigade.
- 4. Correspondence with Enfield Council regarding the refurbishment or rebuilding efforts.
- 5. Any safety inspections or recommendations provided as a result of the incident.

Response:

1. The date and time of the incident.

We have a record of attending one fire incident at 15 Northumberland Avenue, EN1 since the year 2000. The fire took place on 25 February 2008. I have attached a Confirmation of Attendance (COA) report to this response with provides the supposed motive for the fire and timings of the incident.

- 2. The cause of the fire, if determined.
- 3. Any reports or assessments made by the fire brigade.

In response to your request points 2 and 3, full incident reports (including the supposed source of ignition) are not available under the Freedom of Information Act as they are considered a chargeable service and, as such, will incur a fee. As such they are exempt via Section 21 of the FOIA - Information accessible to applicant by other means. Individuals and organisations affected by an incident that was attended by London Fire Brigade since 2007 can request a fire report which, for fires that involve buildings, vehicles, or those that cause injuries, provides more details about the incident and the cause of the fire where known.

If you do want to go ahead and request a copy of a fire report, I must advise that you may not be eligible to receive a copy. However, if any eligible party (such as the owner/a tenant/local borough council/insurance firm or loss adjustor) requests the report documents, and is willing to share it with you, then we would be able to provide consent for them to do this.

- 4. Correspondence with Enfield Council regarding the refurbishment or rebuilding efforts.
- 5. Any safety inspections or recommendations provided as a result of the incident.

In response to your request points 4 and 5, our Fire Safety Regulatory team have confirmed they hold no correspondence with Enfield Council (the Local Authority) and there is no fire safety record held for 15 Northumberland Avenue, EN1. As such, no fire safety audits (inspections) have been conducted at the premises by the LFB.

Please note, if the premises is a house occupied by a single household then the Regulatory Reform (Fire Safety) Order 2005 is unlikely to apply to the premises and, as such, it is not unexpected that a fire safety audit has not been conducted by the LFB for 15 Northumberland Avenue, EN1.

The Fire Safety Order does not apply to individual flats or houses that are occupied by a single household (for example, a family). If the premises is owned by a Local Authority (such as Enfield Council) then, as the Responsible Person (RP) for the building, they may hold information on the refurbishment of the premises following the fire.
