Request:

Fire at St Marks Square, Bromley BR2 9AP ("the Property") Incident Date: 03/07/2022. The information requested from London Fire Brigade in particular includes as follows. We seek: (a) Fire report. (b) The Fire Investigation Report. (c) Call logs from Brigade Headquarters to the LFB, mobilisation and arrival times of appliances and officers and radio message to/from the fireground. If our request is denied in whole or in part, we ask that you justify all deletions by reference to specific exemptions of the Act. We request and expect that you will release all non-exempt material.

Response:

Fire reports are not available under the freedom of information act (FOIA) as they are considered a chargeable service and, as such, will incur a fee. As a result, they are exempt via Section 21 of the FOIA - Information accessible to applicant by other means. Regrettably this means we cannot provide you with a copy of the fire report, fire investigation report, mobilisation report (or the information held within them) without payment.

I have attached a copy of the LFB confirmation of attendance which is produced for all incidents free of charge.
