

Details of the incident

A fire occurred in the ground floor shop and smoke quickly spread into all floors of the residential stair (adjacent and above the shop), the firefighting lobby, the corridors off of this lobby and into some apartments. Smoke also spread into the basement and a large number of fire detectors had triggered, resulting in the alarm sounding throughout the premises.

Smoke Ventilation

On arrival it was difficult to identify if the smoke control was operating as the stairs were inaccessible without breathing apparatus. However, it became apparent that the stair AOV had opened together with the mechanical smoke vent (inlet and outlet) on the 4th floor.

Fire detection and alarm system

An addressable system was installed with detectors in the common parts sounding and operating the smoke ventilation and one detector extended into each apartment. I was informed that in the event of a detector actuating in an apartment, the alarm will sound and also alert the concierge who will instigate and investigation. The coincidence system and the proposed action if a number of alarms or call points are actuated was not clear and on arrival the alarm was sounding thought the premises.

FSR History

It appears that LFB FSR have had some dealings with the premises and the most recent was a complaint made Section 40 – Personal Information.

Fire Safety Issues

A number of fire safety issues have been highlighted below but the main issues was the smoke spread throughout the residential area and the extended travel distance within the shop. See the relevant section below.

Part C - Premises Description

Premises description:

A refurbished building of 9 floors with a multi-level basement which consists of residential apartments on the ground and floors above, commercial units on the ground floors, with fitness facilities, back off house staff areas and a carpark at basement levels.

The north block is in an L shape measuring 92 x 75 meters and has two stairs which are assumed to be firefighting stairs with mechanical ventilation protecting one stair and natural in the stair leading from the concierge. Each stair had an AOV at the top.


A full audit of the premises was not carried out but there were a number of issues noted in both the shop and the apartments these have been identified below under each heading. The cumulative issues have then been added to the table.

Residential apartment


As previously stated, the main concern was the amount of smoke spread from the commercial shop on the ground floor into the apartments and common parts of the residential areas. The main cause of the smoke spread was not determined but the pictures below demonstrating some staining.



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There was an area of glazing between the common stair and the shop and although it was not compromised by the fire (no direct heat was applied) it was not determined whether this would provide adequate fire resistance between each occupancy.



It was also noted that there the stair enclosure at the concierge end was being used to store parcel delivery items. It was also noted the staff were not adverse in the operation of the ventilation system advice given and that the

mechanical ventilation system appeared to start on the 1st floor and there was no vent protecting the stair at ground floor level. Shop The main issue identified with the shop was the extended travel distance in two areas. Firstly the mezzanine, accessed by a spiral stair which looked like it was part of the sales area but not confirmed. 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Secondly the store on the first floor accessed from a stair at the rear of the shop with a travel distance consisting of

approximately 20m from the shop entrance to the stair + one flight of narrow stair + approximately 10m on the first floor.
