Would you kindly be able to supply me with a copy of the enforcement notice served on Newlon Housing Trust in relation to 1 and 3 Queensland Road, Islington, N7 7BY? The date of the notice is July 2017.

Response:

I have checked the records held by the London Fire Brigade (LFB) Fire Safety Regulatory team. It shows that a Fire Safety Audit carried out in 2017 deemed the premises to be compliant.

Therefore, no Enforcement Notice was issued to the Responsible Person(s).

Please see a copy of the letter of compliance. This confirmed that the Enforcement Notice was not issued as the Regulatory Reform (Fire Safety) Order 2005 (RRO) was complied with.

REGULATORY REFORM (FIRE SAFETY) ORDER 2005

Premises: 1 Queensland Road, Islington, N7 7BY

Due to a systems error the Enforcement Notice was never officially issued.
