Request:

I would like to obtain the following information under the Freedom of Information Act 2000. All the information should be relevant to the London borough of Haringey and the London borough of Waltham forest, or London wide.

1- Has the introduction of the Low Traffic Neighbourhood (LTN) scheme increased the time it takes you to reach your destinations/targets?

2- Some councils have bollards blocking the LTN roads or narrowing them. Have there been incidents where Firefighters were forced to remove LTN bollards ? Please give the number of incidents per borough? If such information isn't in your record, please tell us details concerning the London borough of Haringey.
3- The introduction of LTN has caused traffic to flow into the surrounding roads thereby causing huge traffic congestion, has this impacted you?

Response:

We do not hold the information you have requested. However, we do record and publish details of the time it takes for fire engines to arrive at an incident and if any delay codes have been recorded. The information can be found on the London Datastore, here: <u>https://data.london.gov.uk/dataset/london-fire-brigade-mobilisation-records?q=mobil</u>

You can download the 'LFB Mobilisation data - last three years' spreadsheet, and can sort by year of call (column B), station the fire engine was deployed from (column O) and whether a delay code has been recorded (column V). Delay codes could be recorded as 'traffic calming measures' or 'traffic. roadworks etc'.
