BACKGROUND

The Enjoy Waltham Forest programme aims to improve the boroughs streets for everyone and make it a better place to live, work and travel around.

In Autumn 2015 we carried out a public consultation with the local community regarding proposals for the Hoe Street and Wood Street Area scheme. The aim of the proposals were to:

- · Reduce the volume, speed and impact of traffic using residential roads in the area
- · Improve road safety for everyone
- · Encourage more local trips on foot, by bike and by public transport
- · Improve the appearance of the local environment

The majority of proposals were delivered, however in response to local feedback the council decided to defer the introduction of proposals in the Hilltop Area (the area bounded by Howard Road, Forest Road, Shernhall Street and Church Hill - shown on the map on the following page).

The original proposals were deferred until the design of The Bell Junction (Hoe Street/Forest Road junction) was completed and approved, and any changes required in the surrounding residential roads to support the new junction layout were fully understood. 
As part of any future works in the area the council also agreed to review the original proposals for the Hilltop Area and re-engage with local residents on any updated plans, taking into consideration the final design for The Bell junction. As part of this additional engagement, a workshop was conducted for the Hilltop Area, which took place in September 2019. A total of 45 people attended the workshop, which included a number of exercises to help understand local priorities and views towards potential solutions to local transport related concerns, as well as giving residents the opportunity to develop their own ideas for the area.

We have now progressed our plans for the Hilltop Area, taking into consideration feedback received from both the original consultation and the recent workshop. This leaflet provides details regarding the updated design and aims to obtain further feedback from local residents.

PROPOSED IMPROVEMENTS

MODAL FILTERS

To reduce non-local traffic in the Hilltop Area, modal filters (road closures to motorised traffic) are proposed to be introduced with associated pocket parks at various locations.

The modal filters will discourage motorised vehicles aiming to cut through the area while retaining access for local vehicles, emergency services and council services. The modal filters will reduce the amount of traffic in the local area and help to reduce noise and air pollution.

Modal filters are proposed at the following locations:

- . Howard Road junction with Church Hill. This will require the removal of approximately two parking spaces
- · Rectory Road junction with Church Hill. This will require the removal of approximately two parking spaces
- · Seaford Road between Hurst Road and The Drive.

PUBLIC REALM IMPROVEMENTS: POCKET PARKS

Pocket parks proposals will help create new and improved existing, public spaces. These improvements will encourage people to use more sustainable modes of transport such as walking and cycling and public transport, which in turn will help reduce vehicle dominance, create a safer environment and improve air quality.

Public Realm improvements are proposed at the following locations:

- . Howard Road junction with Church Hill
- · Rectory Road junction with Church Hill
- · Seaford Road between Hurst Road and The Drive
- The Drive outside Emmanuel Community School. This will require the removal of approximately two parking spaces.

TRAFFIC CALMING

In recent years, as part of our commitment to reduce the number of traffic collisions and injuries on our roads, we have introduced 20mph speed limits in many of our residential areas. To support the 20mph speed limit already in place in this area we are proposing to upgrade the existing speed cushions to speed humps; as well as introducing new speed humps where there are significant gaps. The new speed humps are easier for people on bikes to use, while still helping to reduce vehicle speeds. The roads where we propose to replace or install new speed humps are:

· Howard Road - Seaford Road to Forest Road

 - (b) all other provisions of this Order on 9th July 2020.

- 1.3 In this Order "pedal cycle" has the same meaning as in the Traffic Signs Regulations and General Directions 2016(b):

- 1.5 "road" in this Order means a "carriageway" as defined in section 329 of the Highways Act 1980

2. Prescribed Routes and Road Closures

2.1 Whilst this Order continues in force and without prejudice to the validity to anything done or to any liability incurred in respect of any Act or any omission before the coming into operation of this Order no person shall cause or permit any motor vehicle proceeding in any road or part of road in the London Borough of Waltham Forest specified in column 1 of Schedule 1 to this Order to enter or proceed in any part of that road, or adjacent footway specified in relation to that road in column 2 of the said Schedule.

3. Exemptions

- 3.1 Nothing in Article 2 of this Order shall apply to:
 - (a) anything done with the permission or at the direction of a police constable in uniform or a traffic warden;

"permitted hours", being the hours during which a permitted vehicle may wait in a parking place whilst complying with the relevant provisions of the Order of 2019, means such period

referred to in column 5 of Schedule 2 of this Order (entitled "Times of operation of parking place") in relation to that parking place;"

"Schedule" means a Schedule to this Order.

- (2) Any reference in this Order to any enactment shall be construed as a reference to that enactment as amended, applied, consolidated, re-enacted by or as having effect by virtue of any subsequent enactment.
- Unless the context otherwise requires, any expression used in this Order which is also used in the Order of 2019 shall have the same meaning as in that Order.

Part substitution of map tiles, suspension and of certain parking provisions

- 3. (1) Whilst this Order continues in force and without prejudice to the validity of anything done or to any liability incurred in respect of any act or omission before the coming into operation of this Order, the Order of 2019 shall have effect as though:
 - (a) for the map tile attached to that Order and specified in column 1 of Schedule 1 to this Order. there were substituted the map tile attached to this Order and specified in relation thereto in column 2 of that Schedule but only in so far as that substitution applies to any hatched area of a section of street specified in relation thereto in column 1, 2 and 3 of any Schedule to this Order, such area also being identified on the relevant map tile attached to this Order by a label depicting the words "Experimental Order"; and
 - (b) for the revision numbers specified in Schedule 2 to the Order of 2019 in relation to the map tiles referred to in sub-paragraph (a) above there were substituted the revision numbers given in column 2 of Schedule 1 to this Order in relation to the corresponding map tiles.
 - (c) the permit parking place specified in column 2, 3 and 4 of an item in Schedule 3 to this Order is hereby suspended; and
 - (2) The substitution of any map tile referred to in Article 3(1) of this Order will have the effect of suspending or omitting any provision provided or designated by a previous version of that map tile and not incorporated into the latest version.

Designation of parking places and application of the Order of 2019 thereto

- (1) Each area on a highway comprising the length of carriageway of a street specified in column 2, 3 and 4 of an item in Schedule 2 of this Order shall be construed as an area marked out and signed for the use therein of specified classes of vehicles following the conditions specified in the Order of 2019 in relation to that type of parking place and unless otherwise so identified is designated as a parking place
 - A parking place shall be bounded on one side of its length by the edge of the carriageway and be an area marked either by a traffic sign or by another method of indicating the extent of a parking place as specified in the Traffic Signs Regulations and General Directions 20169
 - The provisions of the Order of 2019 (other than Articles 4 and 14) shall apply to each area (3) designated as a parking place by this Order as if in those provisions any reference to a parking place included a reference to each area designated as a parking place by this

Placing of traffic signs

- The Council shall:
 - place and maintain traffic signs indicating the parking provisions imposed by this Order;
 - place and maintain in or in the vicinity of each parking place imposed by this Order traffic signs indicating that such a parking place may be used during the permitted hours for the leaving of the vehicles specified in Article 5(1A) of the Order of 2019;

Without prejudice to the validity of anything done or to any liability incurred in respect of any act or omission before the coming into operation of this Order, the Order of 2019 shall have effect as though any length of street specified in columns 2, 3 and 4 of Schedule 2 to this Order shall be treated as if it were a restricted street and the prescribed hours in relation to that restricted street shall be the times specified in relation thereto in column 5 of that said Schedule and shall be construed as though it were a restricted street referred to in the Order of 2019.

Placing of traffic signs, etc.

- The Council shall:-
 - place and maintain traffic signs indicating the limits of each waiting restriction imposed by this Order;
 - carry out such other work as is reasonably required for the purposes of the satisfactory operation of a length of each waiting restriction.

This Order further amends the Waltham Forest (Free Parking Places, Loading Places and Waiting, Loading and Stopping Restrictions) Consolidation Order 2019 so as to create new lengths of 'at any time' waiting restrictions in parts of the roads mentioned in this Order complementary to the Hilltop region cycling, walking and vehicular traffic reduction improvements, on an experimental basis, in the London Borough of Waltham Forest.

MAYOR OF LONDON



In 2018, Waltham Forest Council was successful in securing initial funding from Transport for London (TfL) to develop a Liveable Neighbourhood scheme in the Coppermill Area. At the same time the Council also secured funding to redirect the existing Quietway 2 (soon to be renamed Cycleway 27 by TfL) cycle route. The aim of both schemes is to encourage residents, businesses and visitors to use sustainable modes of transport more often, so that together we can reduce congestion, tackle air pollution and improve the health and wellbeing of local people.

The Coppermill Area Liveable Neighbourhood Scheme encompasses the area bounded by Forest Road and Blackhorse Road Station to the north, St James Street to the east, Argall Industrial Estate to the south/southwest and the Lower Lea Valley/Walthamstow Wetlands to the west. The new Quietway 2 (Cycleway 27) route alignment uses South Access Road, the Argall Business Estate and Lea Bridge Road to link St James Street with the London Borough of Hackney, instead of the current route alignment along Coppermill Lane and through the Lower Lea Valley. This change is being made due to accessibility and personal safety concerns within the Lower Lea Valley.

SCHEME UPDATE:

In January 2020, we sent an update leaflet to all addresses within the scheme area informing the local community of the feedback received to the public consultation that took place in June 2019. The leaflet also included details of the changes that would be progressed towards construction, which was due to start in late Spring 2020. The leaflet can be accessed within the following link:

However, due to the Covid-19 pandemic we have seen a substantial reduction, and in many cases complete withdrawal, of funding for transport and highway improvements. This includes funding that we were expecting from TfL to deliver schemes like the Coppermill Area scheme. As a result we are unfortunately unable to progress some of the schemes we were originally planning to, and have had to prioritise which measures and proposals to take forward based on their expected benefit and amount of funding now available.

Funding for this scheme will now be supported via the TfL "London Streetspace Plan" (LSP), which is aimed at providing emergency funding for implementing lower cost, high impact highways infrastructure schemes that will address various issues related to the Covid-19 pandemic. The LSP schemes aim to encourage and enable social distancing and ease potential pressure on London's streets and transport system by encouraging the use of sustainable and active modes of travel. Unfortunately, the funding being provided through the London Streetspace Programme for the Coppermill Area scheme is significantly less than we were expecting as part of the original Liveable Neighbourhood Scheme. Therefore, certain proposals such as some of the Coppermill Lane corridor improvements, some of the public realm improvements, some of the highways and pedestrian improvements, and the traffic calming improvements will not be delivered at present. However, subject to future funding availability we may be able to review this, and we will update residents with further information via the scheme website.

NEWHAM AND WALTHAM FOREST LOW TRAFFIC NEIGHBOURHOOD

BACKGROUND

The London Boroughs of Newham and Waltham Forest are committed to creating people-friendly streets and neighbourhoods that actively encourage walking, cycling and using public transport. This is why we have been working together over the past 18 months, developing and submitting funding bids to the Transport for London Liveable Neighbourhoods programme for improvements in the Forest Gate, Maryland and South Leytonstone areas.

Due to the Covid-19 pandemic, there is an even more urgent need to improve London's streets for walking and cycling, to reduce pressure on our road and public transport networks, and to support social distancing. With London's public transport capacity currently significantly reduced, millions of journeys a day will need to be completed by other modes of transport. If even a small fraction of these are replaced by car journeys, roads will become heavily congested, air quality will worsen, and road danger will increase. To prevent this from happening in your area, the London Boroughs of Newham and Waltham Forest are creating an experimental Low Traffic Neighbourhood (LTN).

A proposed LTN was included in the 2018 and 2019 joint-borough TfL Liveable Neighbourhoods bids, however, due to the Covid-19 pandemic, TfL has suspended the Liveable Neighbourhoods programme and redirected funding towards emergency interventions to support social distancing and enable active travel.

Even though the Liveable Neighbourhoods funding is currently suspended, both boroughs have allocated funding towards the LTN as part of their commitment to delivering better streets for walking and cycling.

With many residents from both boroughs not owning a motorised vehicle and the current limited capacity on public transport, we need to ensure that walking and cycling is a safe and attractive option.

WHAT IS A LOW TRAFFIC NEIGHBOURHOOD?

The LTN will mean that motorised vehicles will no longer be able to use the area as a cut through to avoid main roads, which is known as 'rat running'. (As an example, based on detailed traffic surveys completed during the original bid process we estimate that around 40-45% of vehicles use Odessa Road to cut through the area.) Local residents, businesses, visitors and services, such as waste collection and emergency services will still be able to access every address within the LTN boundary.

With less traffic, noise and pollution, local streets will be safe and more pleasant to use, especially for children to cross the road and walk and cycle to school. The LTN will reduce the level of harmful emissions from motorised vehicles driving through the area, help people stay physically active and healthy, and encourage a shift to more sustainable modes of transport.

YOUR VIEWS

Normally we would consult with local people before building a scheme such as this. However, due to the Covid-19 pandemic, we need to act quickly to keep our roads safe and we will therefore start construction in mid-August 2020.

We have, however, been engaging with local people since 2018 to find out what they think about the area and any changes they would like to see. The feedback received highlighted that vehicle speeds, safety and lack of cycle routes were key barriers to people walking and cycling, which have helped us develop this experimental scheme.

To help us refine the LTN scheme and ensure we get it right, we will be running an online map-based survey for at least six months to get your views on the scheme. This will allow us to make potential short-term changes to improve the experimental scheme where needed and will also inform the design of a possible permanent scheme.

LOW TRAFFIC NEIGHBOURHOOD SCHEME

The scheme will use modal filters (road closures to motorised vehicles) to create a Low Traffic Neighbourhood. The modal filters will be placed on an experimental basis, initially in two areas, which are called Area 1 and Area 2, and are shown on the map overleaf.

To begin with, the experimental modal filters will be installed for 6 to 18 months and during this time we will be gathering local feedback, consulting key stakeholders and collecting traffic data to help determine whether the scheme will be made permanent in the future.

- Area 1 falls mainly within the London Borough of Newham and is bounded by Crownfield Road, Leytonstone Road, Forest Lane and Leyton Road. Five modal filters are proposed for this area, all within Newham.
- Area 2 is bounded by Cann Hall Road, Dames Road, Woodgrange Road, Forest Lane and Leyton Road. A total of twelve modal filters are proposed, seven of these are in Newham and five in Waltham Forest.

The majority of modal filters will be created by using large planters placed in the streets at various locations to restrict access for motorised vehicles, but these will still allow enough space for pedestrians and cyclists to travel through them.

Some modal filters will be enforced via CCTV and there will not be a physical barrier in place. This is to allow access for emergency vehicles only. All other motorised vehicles will not be allowed to travel through these modal filters and will be issued with a Penalty Charge Notice (PCN) if they do.

However, while all addresses will be accessible via motorised vehicle, some drivers may need to use a slightly different route than before. 

WHAT HAPPENS NEXT?

Due to the urgent requirement to implement this scheme, construction works will start in mid-August 2020, and each area is scheduled to be completed within a two-week period. During this time, our construction teams will aim to minimise disruption and will be adhering to guidelines around Covid-19 safe working standards.

Traffic restrictions for the modal filters will be implemented via Experimental Traffic Orders (ETOs). The first six months form part of the statutory consultation, where residents can formally comment on the ETOs. The London Boroughs of Waltham Forest and Newham will be advertising the necessary ETOs and publicising these in accordance with legal requirements.

SOUTH LEYTONSTONE LOW TRAFFIC NEIGHBOURHOOD (LTN)

BACKGROUND

Waltham Forest Council is committed to creating peoplefriendly streets and neighbourhoods that actively encourage walking, cycling and using public transport. That's why we've spent the past 18 months developing and submitting funding bids to the Transport for London (TfL) Liveable Neighbourhoods programme for improvements in South Leytonstone, as well as Forest Gate and Maryland in partnership with the London Borough of Newham (LBN).

Due to the Covid-19 pandemic, there is an even more urgent need to improve London's streets for walking and cycling, to reduce pressure on our road and public transport networks. With London's public transport capacity currently significantly reduced, millions of journeys a day need to be completed by other modes of transport. If these are replaced by car journeys, streets will become heavily congested, air quality will reduce, and road danger will increase. In some places we are already seeing traffic levels increase above pre Covid-19 levels.

To prevent this from happening, in August 2020 we partnered up with LBN to introduce an experimental Low Traffic Neighbourhood (LTN) in the Forest Gate, Maryland and South Leytonstone areas. This area is referred to as Area 1 and Area 2 and is bounded by Crownfield Road, Cann Hall Road, Dames Road, Woodgrange Road, Forest Lane,

Leytonstone Road and Leyton Road. We are now extending this scheme further in South Leytonstone into the areas bounded by Ferndale Road, Montague Road, Harrow Road, Cann Hall Road, Crownfield Road, High Road Leyton, the A12 and Cathall Road (which we are referring to as Area 3 and Area 4).

These LTN schemes were included in the 2018 and 2019 joint-borough TfL Liveable Neighbourhoods bids and were developed taking into consideration feedback from the community engagement that took place during each bid process. However, due to the Covid-19 pandemic, TfL suspended the Liveable Neighbourhoods programme and redirected funding towards emergency interventions to support social distancing and enable active travel. Even though the Liveable Neighbourhoods funding is currently suspended, both boroughs allocated funding towards the LTN Area 1 and Area 2 as part of their commitment to delivering better streets for walking and cycling.

Since launching Area 1 and Area 2 Waltham Forest Council has secured funding from TfL's London Streetspace Plan (LSP) to deliver Area 3 and Area 4 of the LTN scheme, to ensure we deliver a scheme that will benefit the wider South Leytonstone area.







LOW TRAFFIC NEIGHBOURHOOD

The scheme involves installing 11 modal filters (road closures to motorised vehicles) to create a LTN.

This will mean that motorised vehicles will no longer be able to use the area as a cut through to avoid main roads, which is known as 'rat running'. Recent data analysis of car usage in the area shows that 40 to 60 per cent of car journeys on most roads in Area 4 are vehicles cutting through the area.

With less traffic, noise and pollution, local streets will be safe and more pleasant to use, especially for children to cross the road and walk or cycle to school. The LTN will reduce the level of harmful emissions from motorised vehicles driving through the area, help people stay physically active and healthy, and encourage a shift to more sustainable modes of transport.

To begin with, the experimental modal filters will be installed for 6 to 18 months and during this time we will be gathering local feedback, consulting key stakeholders and collecting traffic data to help determine whether the scheme will be made permanent in the future.

Area 3 is bounded by Crownfield Road, High Road Leyton, the A12, Cathall Road and High Road Leytonstone, and has a total of four modal filters proposed.

Area 4 is bounded by Ferndale Road, Montague Road, Harrow Road, Cann Hall Road and High Road Leytonstone, and has a total of seven modal filters proposed.

Please see the map for exact locations of the modal filters.

The modal filters will be created by using large planters and bollards placed in the streets at various locations to restrict access for motorised vehicles, but these will still allow enough space for pedestrians and cyclists to travel through them. Some of the modal filters will include lockable bollards to be used by emergency services should they need to.

When the modal filters are installed all addresses will continue to be accessible for residents, visitors, deliveries, etc, however the way you reach your property via your usual routes may change. As with all changes to the highway it can take a little while for people to get used to the new layouts, therefore we ask that you take the time to view the map to identify any changes to your regular journeys.

We know emergency services access can be a concern and we need to make sure that they can continue to provide a vital service for the community. The emergency services are also statutory consultees which is why we work closely with them on all schemes to ensure they are fully consulted before work begins. Please be assured that we will continue to liaise regularly with the emergency services to ensure the scheme is working for them and any issues are identified early.

SCHOOL STREETS

Alongside the LTN we are working with schools in the area to introduce School Streets, which involve temporarily closing one or more of the streets surrounding a school to most vehicles for a short period at the start and end of the school day. Doing this helps improve road safety, reduces inconsiderate parking and dangerous vehicle movements, improves air quality around the school and makes it easier for pupils, parents, carers and staff to walk, scoot and cycle to school.

To date we have introduced School Streets in the South Leytonstone area at The Jenny Hammond Primary School and Davies Lane Primary School, and will be introducing a School Street at Buxton School on Monday 2 November.

The School Street zone for Buxton School will include the following roads where vehicles will be restricted at the start and end of the school day: Woodhouse Road, Terling Close, Newcomen Road, Jenny Hammond Close and Courtenay Road.

The School Street will operate between 8.15am and 9.15am and 2.30pm and 3.00pm, Monday to Friday, term-time only. Residents who live within the School Streets zone will receive a separate leaflet, which will contain further information on the School Streets trial.

YOUR VIEWS

During the Liveable Neighbourhoods funding bids to TfL in 2018 and 2019 we launched several perception surveys, inviting the local community to tell us about the area, what the key issues were, and what could be improved. This was used to help develop and support the bids. Normally, we would do further engagement with local people before building a scheme such as this. However, due to the Covid-19 pandemic, we need to act quickly to keep our roads safe and we will therefore start construction from 19 October 2020.

This does not mean that we are rushing scheme delivery but are working to create a dialogue with local people to ensure the changes are right for the area. The views of local people are vital to the success of these schemes and as we have done with Area 1 and Area 2, we will be running our engagement activity alongside implementation of the scheme to capture and respond to local views from the start. Not only is this method of engaging encouraged by central government, it also allows local people to see the immediate effects of the changes and provide feedback on actual experiences.

To help us refine the LTN scheme, we will be running an online map-based survey for at least six months to get your views on the scheme. This will allow us to make potential short-term changes to improve the experimental scheme where needed and will also inform the design of a possible permanent scheme. Please note that although we are not conducting an informal public consultation in advance, the scheme is subject to a statutory consultation, where anyone can formally comment on the Experimental Traffic Orders (ETOs) within the first six months.



WHAT HAPPENS NEXT?

Construction works will start from 19 October 2020, and both Area 3 and Area 4 are scheduled to be completed within a two-week period. Residents located next to a modal filter will receive a construction notification letter before work begins. Traffic restrictions for the modal filters will be implemented via ETOs. The first six months form part of the statutory consultation, where residents can formally comment on the ETOs. Waltham Forest Council has advertised the necessary ETOs and publicised these in accordance with legal requirements.

COPPERMILL AREA SCHEME UPDATE (JANUARY 2021)









MAYOR OF LONDON



In 2018, Waltham Forest Council was successful in securing initial funding from Transport for London (TfL) to develop a Liveable Neighbourhoods scheme in the Coppermill Area. The aim the scheme is to encourage residents, businesses and visitors to use more sustainable modes of transport in their day-to-day lives, so that together we can reduce congestion, tackle air pollution and improve the health and wellbeing of local people.

The Coppermill Area Liveable Neighbourhoods scheme encompasses the area bounded by Forest Road and Blackhorse Road Station to the north, St James Street to the east, Argall Industrial Estate to the south/southwest and the Lower Lea Valley/Walthamstow Wetlands to the west.

SCHEME UPDATE:

In July 2020, we sent an update leaflet to all addresses within the scheme area informing the local community about how Covid-19 had affected funding for highway and transport improvements in the borough; and that Transport for London (TfL) was unable to provide planned funding for Liveable Neighbourhoods schemes across London, including the Coppermill Area scheme. Instead, TfL provided replacement emergency funding called the "London Streetspace Plan" (LSP), to enable implementation of some highway changes to address various issues related to the Covid-19 pandemic. The leaflet outlined the changes being taken forward in the Coppermill area with funding from the LSP, and can be accessed within the following link:

The schemes that were outlined in the above leaflet have now been implemented. Where measures have been introduced on an interim/experimental basis, ongoing monitoring is currently taking place to understand how these measures are performing. The results of the monitoring and review process will help inform further decisions on whether to make these measures permanent, make adjustments, or possibly withdraw them.

The Council has recently been able to secure further funding from TfL for the Coppermill area. This additional funding will enable some of the other measures planned as part of the original Liveable Neighbourhoods scheme to be delivered. Unfortunately, the additional funding is not sufficient to deliver everything that formed part of the original scheme at this stage, but still represents a significant further investment in the area. These will include the Coppermill Lane corridor improvements, some of the public realm improvements, the highways and pedestrian improvements and the traffic calming improvements.
