I am writing to request any report(s) of investigation(s) into the cause(s) of the fire at Croydon University Hospital in March 2023 and the response(s) to the fire held by the Service.

I have attached the confirmation of attendance report for the fire that took place at Croydon University Hospital on 05 March 2023 to this response.

The LFB incident number for the fire that took place at Croydon University Hospital on 05 March 2023 is 032041-05032023.

If you download the '<u>LFB Incident Data from 2018</u>' spreadsheet, you can use this incident number to find the entry recorded for the fire.

Fire investigation reports are not available under the freedom of information act (FOIA) as they are considered a chargeable service and, as such, will incur a fee. As a result they are exempt via <u>Section 21 of the FOIA - Information accessible to applicant by other means</u>.

Individuals and organisations affected by an incident that was attended by London Fire Brigade since 2007 can request a 'fire report' which, for fires that involve buildings, vehicles, or those that cause injuries, provides more details about the incident and the cause of the fire where known.

If you do want to go ahead and request a copy of a fire report, I must advise that you may not be eligible to receive a copy. However, if any eligible party (such as the owner/a tenant/local borough council/insurance firm or loss adjustor) requests the report documents, and is willing to share it with you, then we would be able to provide consent for them to do this.

Please also note that we would also require written permission from the Metropolitan Police Service (MPS) to release any information to eligible parties about deliberate fires.

I am also writing to request any report(s) of lessons learned as a consequence of the above and how these lessons have been implemented.

The Responsible Person for fire safety at Croydon University Hospital would be in charge of making decisions about any fire safety improvements (lessons learned) and implemented following a fire.

As the enforcing authority under the Regulatory Reform (Fire Safety) Order, 2005, (RRO) the Brigade has a role in enforcing fire safety legislation and a LFB Senior Fire Safety Officer (SFSO) attended Croydon University Hospital on 05 March 2023 following the fire.

I have attached a copy of the SFSO report held for incident number 032041-05032023 to this response. Please note I have made the following redactions:

Personal data has also been removed from the SFSO report under <u>section 40 of the FOIA – Personal</u> Information.

Fire safety deficiency information has been redacted under section 31 of the FOIA ("law enforcement" – Section 31(1)(g) combined with 31(2) (a) and 31(2) (c)). We clearly understand that there is public interest and concern about knowing about the fire safety of the buildings in which people live, work or visit however we need to maintain a balance between the public interest in safety and the LFB's ability to work with responsible persons in a safe space where honest, frank and meaningful discussions can take place. It is important that enforcing authorities are assisted in their investigations. If witnesses, and those responsible for compliance with regulations, are able to cooperate with the investigation on a voluntary basis then investigators are able to take full contemporaneous notes (that are recorded on the SFSO report) and enter in discussions with those involved to enable them to explore all aspects of the case and then arrive at a decision as to the appropriate action to take.

Information about the LFB's pre-determined attendance (PDA) to hospital incidents is redacted under section 24 of the FOIA - National security. Whilst we acknowledge there is a public interest in knowing that the London Fire Brigade has adequate procedures in place to deal with any emergency incident involving public safety, the disclosure of these details would, or would be likely to, provide anyone wanting to carry out acts of terrorism with a detailed plan of our pre-planned emergency response and in turn damage the Brigade's ability to respond efficiently and effectively, and placing public safety at risk. It is for this reason we conclude that the public interest in withholding the information, outweighs the public interest in disclosure.

Photos have been redacted from this document as they are exempt from release under <u>section 21 of the FOIA - Information accessible to applicant by other means</u>. Photos and videos can be requested through <u>photosandvideos@london-fire.gov.uk</u>. However, please do bear in mind that they are subject as the same eligibility criteria as incident reports, including Police consent to disclose (as explained in my response to your first question).

I have also removed page 7 to 9 of the SFSO report as these just provide instructions to the SFSO on how to complete the report.
