## Response:

In response, some information about the fire that took place at Forest Gate police station on 06 March 2024 can be found on the LFB website here: <a href="https://www.london-fire.gov.uk/incidents/2024/march/building-fire-forest-gate/">https://www.london-fire.gov.uk/incidents/2024/march/building-fire-forest-gate/</a>

In addition, the LFB publish details of every incident responded to since January 2009 through the London Datastore. The LFB incident number for the fire that took place at Forest Gate police station on 06 March 2024 is 037573-06032024.

If you download the 'LFB Incident Data from 2018' spreadsheet, you can use this incident number to find the entry recorded for the fire. The total number of pumps in attendance at this fire is included in column AJ, 'PumpCount'.

If you download the '<u>LFB Mobilisation data from 2021 – 2024'</u> spreadsheet, you can use the LFB incident number (037573-06032024) to search for attendance information published about the Forest Gate police station fire.

A full list of attendance is held by the LFB on the 'Mobilisation report (end-of-incident report)'. Mobilisation reports are not available under the freedom of information act (FOIA) as they are considered a chargeable service and, as such, will incur a fee. As such they are exempt via Section 21 of the FOIA - Information accessible to applicant by other means.

Individuals and organisations affected by an incident that was attended by London Fire Brigade since 2007 can request a fire report which, for fires that involve buildings, vehicles, or those that cause injuries, provides more details about the incident and the cause of the fire where known.

If you do want to go ahead and request a copy of a fire report, I must advise that you may not be eligible to receive a copy. However, if any eligible party (such as the owner/a tenant/local borough council/insurance firm or loss adjustor) requests the report documents, and is willing to share it with you, then we would be able to provide consent for them to do this.
