### Conclusion

I attended Panache (dry cleaners) 162 Broadway, West Ealing, W13 0TL, on 09/10/2023. This was a demand led FSO1, following fire safety concerns from residents, living in converted flats behind premises. Pre-audit research was carried as follows:-

# Reason for audit;

A demand led FSO1 carried out after fire safety concerns raised by residents of flats behind the shop.

### Conclusion

I attended Ocean Fresh (fish& chip take away), 166 Broadway, West Ealing, W13 0TL, on 05/10/2023. This was a demand led FSO1 carried out y myself, following fire safety concerns from residents living behind the premises. Pre Audit research was carried out as follows:-

- \* Farynor
- \* IMS/BOSS
- \* LFB Data
- \* F.S. Portal
- \* I-Mapping
- \* Companies House
- \* Primary Authority
- \* Google.

The fire safety inspection commenced by carrying out a 360 to check the façade and access for LFB Appliances. Hydrant Locations were checked. I met with the R.P Saqib Ejaz, and explained the reason for the audit (FSO 2005). I explained the audit process, and the extent of the audit (full inspection). Premises is very small with a simple layout, and 1x M.O.E (main entrance). The following was evidenced:-

- \* Fire risk assessment has been considered, but no evidence was provided, that the significant findings have been recorded.
- \* Extraction system exits on flat roof above premises. No evidence of a TR19 certificate.
- \* Only two employees, who are aware of a basic emergency action plan. However, training does not include the safe use of deep fat fryers, and the use of correct extinguishing media.
- \* No Fire Detection on premises.

Overall, the R.P has a proactive attitude towards fire safety. There were no fire safety issues identified that could cause a risk to residents living behind the shop. End of audit.

### **Extent of premises audited**

Full inspection of premises was carried out.

### Justification of audit outcome

Verbal advice give to the R.P on the following:-

- \* Use a competent person to carry out a fire risk assessment
- \* Consider fire detection for business continuity.
- \* Consider fire safety training for staff members to include the safe use of deep fat fryers.
- \* Consider a wet chemical fire extinguisher.
- \* Copies of a TR19 certificate should be made available upon request.
