Request:

I have a question about distinguishing service types - particularly 'Road traffic collisions' and 'Other transport incidents'. Can you tell me what the difference is between them and give me a few examples? I'm trying to understand how you group incidents on the road - I understand that a crush of two active vehicles is an RTC, but what about a bus driving into a building or a pedestrian hit by a car?

Response:

Incidents attended by the Brigade that do not involve firefighting, such as flooding and road traffic collisions, are recorded on our Incident Management System (IMS) as 'special service' incidents.

When a Road Traffic Collision (RTC) is attended, there is a list of subcategories on the IMS used to record RTCs. These categories are as follows:

RTC - Advice only

RTC - Extrication of person/s

RTC - Make scene safe

RTC - Make vehicle safe

RTC - Medical assistance provided only

RTC - Other action

RTC - Release of persons

RTC - Stand by - no action

RTC - Wash down road

If other transport incidents are attended, there is a separate list of subcategories on our Incident Management System (IMS) that can be used to record the LFB attendance. These categories are as follows:

Other transport incident - Advice only

Other transport incident - Extraction of person/s

Other transport incident – Make scene safe

Other transport incident – Make vehicle safe

Other transport incident - Medical assistance provided only

Other transport incident – Other action

Other transport incident - Release of Person/s

Other transport incident – Stand by – No action

Other transport incidents are transport incidents that are not road traffic collisions, for example these could include other forms of transport (such as trains, aeroplanes or boats) or incidents involving road vehicles that are not involved in a collision (such as an oil spill or a person locked in a car).
